Dear Friends

On the Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> July 1945 Great Britain went to the polls. While fighting was still going on in the Far East the war time coalition government was dissolved, and electioneering began. The result of the election was delayed until the 26<sup>th</sup> July so the votes of service men could be count. The result was a Labour landslide by 146 seats .

In 1942, during the War, William Beveridge, a liberal economist, published his famous report which proposed widespread changes to the social welfare system to address the five evils Want, Disease, Ignorance, Squalor and Idleness. When Clement Attlee and the Labour Party came into power in 1945, they set about implementing the plans for a 'cradle to the grave welfare state'. It is probably the case that even if the Conservatives had won many of Beveridge's proposals would have been implemented as the Historian David Runciman points out in his radio 4 series Postwar.

It was the 1945 Labour Government that implemented the 1946 National Insurance Act which gave to those paying rights to flat-rate pensions, sickness benefit, unemployment benefit, and funeral benefit it also included unemployment and sickness benefit, maternity grant and attendance allowance, maternity allowance, widow's benefit, widow's pensions in special cases, guardian's allowance. With this government we also see developments in education, begun during the war, to give a universal primary and secondary system; the foundation of the Arts Council; the beginning of New Towns, the Town and country planning act which introduced the concept of Listed Buildings. We, of course, must not forget the foundation of The National Health Service. Alongside these changes were a plethora of Nationalisation, Railways, Coal, Iron and Steel, Electricity, Gas.

How much of this would have happened under the Conservatives, we don't know, probably not the nationalizations, but even with several Conservative governments since 1951 we still follow the Squalor, basic pattern set out by the 1945 Labour Government. So, although the world we now live in is very different from the late 1940s, that basic pattern set by the postwar labour government is still the guide for how our society works. The ideas that we take care of the weakest and neediest, that we provide education to all, we have a health service which is free at the point of access, that those who have fallen on hard times are looked after, that the state is there to support all of us from the cradle to the grave and that we continue to address the five evils of Want, Disease, Ignorance, Squalor and Idleness. But it is a different society and that means that we have to adjust how we do these things. Even the labour government had to make modification to their plans notably stopping free dentistry. Yes, things need to change but we should be proud of the nearly 80 years of the welfare state.

In general terms initial enquiries should be sent to either Jess Ashbridge or John Howard.

A Parish Council meeting was held on Monday 14th July 2025. In attendance were our County Councillor, Henry Batchelor and our District Councillor Geoff Harvey; 3 parishioners attended.

**Public participation** – A parishioner asked why the previous minutes included reference to their field and caravans. He informed the Council that the caravans were being removed, with one to remain on site for his personal use as occasional shelter. The field is used solely for recreational purposes with the intention of keeping animals there, including alpacas and chickens. The Council thanked the parishioner for attending and sharing this information.

A separate parishioner raised concerns regarding safety at the playground site adjacent to the village hall, particularly in relation to a forthcoming event. The Council acknowledged these concerns and, as funds have been previously allocated to support the demolition of the existing playground, agreed to contact HVCA to confirm the current status of the demolition.

The application to develop **Kingsway Solar Farm** is ongoing with a formal consultation planned for after the summer holiday period; the consultation will be managed and the application decided by the Planning Inspectorate. More information can be found at <https://national-infrastructure-consenting.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/projects/EN010165> with an action group from affected communities at <https://kingswaysolarcommunityaction.co.uk/>.

Council leaders have announced they have identified 3 preferred options for creating new unitary councils across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. This is in response to the national government requirement to replace the current district, county and city councils with simpler unitary councils, instead of two tiers of local

government. From April 2028, rather than dealing with separate county, city, and district authorities, residents will access all services through a unitary council. A public consultation has opened at <https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/council/council-structure/local-government-in-cambridgeshire/devolution-and-local-government-reorganisation/have-your-say-on-local-government-reorganisation> The consultation closes at midnight on Sunday 20 July 2025.

Following a change to the law as part of the Elections Act, postal votes no longer apply indefinitely. They now expire after a period of three years. Due to the timing of the reapplication legislation, around 15,000 South Cambridgeshire postal votes are due to expire at the end of January 2026. The South Cambs Elections Team will be contacting those residents whose postal vote will be expiring to explain that to keep their postal vote in place they will need to make a fresh application. Unfortunately, the change in the law means that affected electors who do not make a fresh application will have their postal votes removed at the end of January 2026. **Planning** – The Acorn anaerobic biodigester planning application finally came to Suffolk County Council's planning committee in June and was refused. Acorn have stated that they plan to appeal.

**Planning Enforcement** - the signs at the bottom of Howards Lane are being investigated by Planning Compliance.

**Grass Cutting** – A quote was received and agreed by the Parish Council to adjust the current cutting regime to include a regular cut of one metre from the curb/pavement on relevant verges; we continue to cut according to Plantlife's good practice guidance.

**Neighbourhood Plan** – funding has been withdrawn by the government for 2025-6 for all neighbourhood plans; they say they continue to support neighbourhood plans. We are awaiting information detailing what sort of support is available. The June meeting was cancelled as there was no new update and we were waiting for this decision; further discussions are needed about the future of our plan.

**The Glebelands** – We understand the s106 agreement has been signed but has not yet been made public.

**Bus stops on the A1307 at Alington Terrace** – The County Council are still looking at the path along the A1307 and mechanisms to enable the replacement of the bus shelters. The Parish council has asked for urgent consideration of this matter.

**Reducing Flood Risk** - A meeting with the County Council Senior Flood Officer, Projects, Jason Tyrell with Parishioners and Chris Covey from Streetly Hall Estates and a representative from the Vestey Estate, was held on the 16<sup>th</sup> May. The meeting aimed to investigate the flooding problems that had occurred on the West Wickham Road adjacent to College Farm and to trace the upstream drainage system. Jason confirmed that a contract had been placed to jet the culvert that passes under the West Wickham Road and would feed back the outcome. The owner of College Farm was also requested to clear the vegetation from the drainage ditch downstream of the culvert as such obstruction may be considered to be a contributory factor in the flooding. The jetting is outstanding and the ditch to date has been partially cleared.

**Footpaths** – Footpaths have been kept reasonably clear by landowners; we have had a positive response to requests from Streetly Hall Estates which oversees most of the public right of ways in the Parish.

**Wildwood** - The noise levels from this year's event were considered acceptable. Although the sound carried to the far end of the village, near the Withersfield boundary, it was not deemed to be intrusive. The availability of a contact telephone number during the event was noted and appreciated.

**Our next scheduled meeting is Monday 8<sup>th</sup> September 2025.**

**Vaccines Update**

As we approach the colder months, there are a number of vaccines that can help protect you against serious illness, including:

FLU - this vaccine helps protect against flu, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness. It's offered on the NHS every year in autumn or early winter to people at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

COVID-19 - the Covid-19 vaccine helps protect against Covid-19, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness for some people. It's usually offered on the NHS in early winter to people who need extra protection from Covid-19.

RSV - the RSV vaccine helps protect against Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) that can make babies and older adults seriously ill. This is offered all year round.

SHINGLES - this vaccine helps protect against shingles and is offered all year round. Shingles is a common condition that causes a painful rash. It can sometimes lead to serious problems such as long-lasting pain, hearing loss or blindness. You're more likely to get shingles, and it is more likely to cause serious problems, as you get older or if you have a severely weakened immune system.

PNEUMOCOCCAL (pneumonia) - this vaccine is offered all year round. It helps protect against serious illnesses like pneumonia and meningitis. Book your flu vaccine with us and when you come in we can check

## **Flu Vaccinations 2025**

**It is that time of year again already! If you book your flu vaccine with us, we can also check that you are up to date with all of the other vaccines you may be eligible for.**

The flu vaccination programme starts in October for all eligible adults, except pregnant women and children, who will be offered the vaccination from late September. Pregnant women are vaccinated to protect both mum and baby in first few weeks of life. Children get flu earlier than adults as they are “super spreaders

You should get vaccinated because:

- Getting vaccinated against flu can help protect you, your family and friends.
- Everyone is susceptible to flu, even if you are in good health and eat well.
- You can be infected with the virus and have no symptoms but can still pass flu virus to others, including family and friends, patients or residents.
- The ‘flu vaccine has a good safety record and will help protect you. It cannot give you flu.
- The impact of flu on frail and vulnerable patients can be fatal and outbreaks can cause severe disruption in communities, care homes and hospitals.

You are eligible for a free NHS flu vaccination if you:

- are aged 65 and over
- have certain long term health conditions
- are pregnant
- live in a care home
- are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer’s allowance
- live with someone who has a weakened immune system

Additionally, eligible children include:

- children aged 2 to 3 years
- school aged children (reception to year 11)
- children aged 6 months to 17 years with certain long term health conditions

**This year we are also giving the Covid-19 vaccination at the same time as the flu, if you are eligible.** You are eligible if you are:

- a resident in a care home for older adults
- aged 75 years and over
- aged 6 months and over and are severely immunocompromised

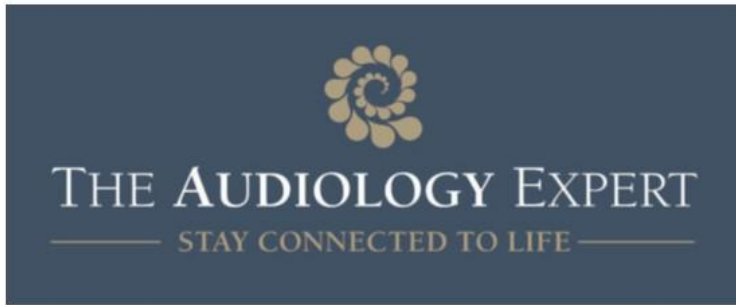
